

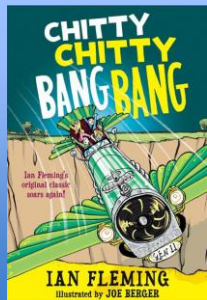
Maths

We will start by working on a unit all about Algebra where we will be introduced to how to form equations, use formulae and solve equations.
